

NEW LAW: ESSB 5557

I would be remiss if I didn't take this opportunity to mention that we celebrated Monday with our colleagues from across the state as Gov. Jay Inslee signed ESSB 5557 into law. The new law requires health insurance carriers to treat pharmacists the same as other health care providers. While commercial health plans have historically recognized pharmacists for dispensing medications, they routinely refused to include pharmacists in their participating provider networks.



I look forward to the additional opportunities that will be available to our graduates in the state of Washington as a result of this legislation, and I would like to thank the Washington State Pharmacy Association for inviting the WSU College of Pharmacy to join in their efforts to advocate for this law and participate in the continued discussion that will bring the process to fruition.
