As a pharmacist, I hope to work with immigrant and low income populations to increase their understanding of their medications and their health, and to empower them to seek knowledge and utilize it as well as pass it on to their children.

FAQ's

- 1) What picture do I use and where should I put it?

We suggest you use your PY1 headshot. Which can be found here:

Your picture should be professional in nature. Please do not use pictures of you at the beach, on vacation, at a family gathering, etc.

- 2) Please embed this photo within the body of the thank you letter. Do not attach it in the e-mail sent to the scholarship committee. Should I mail a printed copy of the letter to the donor in addition to e-mailing an electronic version to the College?

No. The donor's mailing address is provided in the e-mail so you can create a thank you letter that is formatted correctly, not for you to mail your letter directly to them.

- 3) My e-mail identifies that there is more than one donor for this particular scholarship. Am I able to use the same letter for each donor?

Yes, you may use the same letter for each. Just make sure you correctly address each letter.

- 4) The scholarship is for \$1200, can I have that all the first semester?

No. We split the scholarship up between the two semesters.

There are no exceptions to this rule.

- 5) How do I know if you received my letter by the deadline?

We recommend you give yourself plenty of time send your letter to the scholarship team and receive confirmation before your deadline. Please send your letter with a read receipt. That way you are not waiting for our team to send you a response.

What if I do not have electronic signature capabilities?

There are two options:

We will accept a hand written signature scanned in and saved above your typed signature –OR– just a typed signature will suffice.

We will NOT accept a signature created in Paint or any similar program.
