Pharmacy 499 *Special Problems* variable 1 to 4 cr. Contact Pharmacotherapy Faculty for project list (**Offered Fall and Spring**) Independent study conducted under the jurisdiction of an approving faculty member; may include independent research studies in technical or specialized problems; selection and analysis of specified readings; development of a creative project; or field experiences.

PharDSci 499 *Special Problems* variable 1 to 4 May be repeated for credit; cumulative maximum 12 hours. (**Offered Fall and Spring**) Independent study conducted under the jurisdiction of an approving faculty member; may include independent research studies in technical or specialized problems; selection and analysis of specified readings; development of a creative project; or field experiences.

Pharmacy 580 *Practical Politics and Pharmacy* 1 cr. Course Prerequisite: admission to the pharmacy program. (**Offered Spring Only**) Study of government and legislation to better assist patients in navigating the political process.

Pharmacy 588 *Personal Finance for Pharmacists* 1 cr. (**Offered Spring only**) Personal finance course intended for student pharmacists.

Pharmacy 588 Yakima Only *Family Medicine* 2 cr. (**Offered Spring only**) Yakima PY3 students only.

Pharmacy 574 Spokane and Yakima *Veterinary Pharmacy* 2 cr. (**Offered online Spring Only**) Explore basic pathophysiology of diseases in small and large animals and current treatments likely to be dispensed by community pharmacists.

Pharmacy 590 Spokane and Yakima *Advanced Infectious Disease Elective* 2 cr. (**Offered Spring only**) Course Prerequisite: PHARMACY 554 (PY3 standing) Advanced knowledge of infectious disease topics covered in therapeutic pharmacy coursework. H, S, F grading.

Pharmacy 591 *Advanced Elective in Critical Care* 2 cr. Course Prerequisite: PHARMACY 554. (**Offered in the PY3 year spring semester**) Explores in greater depth the pharmacology and pharmacotherapy encountered in the critical care setting.

Pharmacy 592 *Mental Health First Aid* 2 cr. Skills, education, and awareness in topics related to mental health and the ability to provide assistance and education in mental health crises.

Pharmacy 593 *Residency Preparation* 2 cr. Course Prerequisite: Admission to Pharmacy program. An introduction to the residency experience and methods to succeed in attaining a pharmacy residency. Typically offered Spring. H, S, F grading.

Pharmacy 596 *Entrepreneurship in Pharmacy* 1 cr. (**Offered Spring only**) Entrepreneurship and innovative pharmacy business plan development.

Pharmacy 599 *Special Projects* 2 cr. Contact Pharmacotherapy Faculty for project list (**Offered Fall and Spring**) Laboratory research, clinical research, or comprehensive review of selected subjects.

PharDSci 599 *Special Projects* 2 cr. Contact Pharmaceutical Sciences Faculty for project list (**Offered Fall and Spring**) Laboratory research, clinical research, or comprehensive review of selected subjects.

Pharmaceutical Sciences Graduate Courses
